Summary of Project Activities and Accomplishments:

Through this grant the Brownhelm Historical Association has been able to organize, catalog, rehouse, and make accessible their collection of genealogical material. The grant allowed the organization to purchase the software, equipment, and archival supplies necessary to complete this project. The collection has been organized by family surname, housed in archivally sound folders, photograph sleeves, and clamshell boxes, and is now stored in a climate and light controlled facility. This reorganization has allowed us to consolidate the collection from 10 cubic feet down to 4.5 cubic feet (Attachment 1). All photographs and select documents from the collection have been scanned and stored in the PastPerfect database as well as on a backup external drive. A finding aid has been created from PastPerfect for ease of locating collections efficiently (Attachment 2). This finding aid has been shared with other local historical institutions and is now accessible online.

When the project was completed, the Brownhelm Historical Association sent out a press release to local news organization. Several articles have since been published in local newspapers featuring the collection (Attachments 3&4). The Lorain Morning Journal stated, "A grant received by the Ohio Historical Records Advisory Board has allowed the Brownhelm Historical Association to catalog and further organize its genealogy collection for researchers and the public." The Elyria Chronicle article mentioned, "The group is hoping that by spreading the word about the collection it will spur even more donations to add to the archives."

We also published our work through our Facebook page which has over 1200 followers, leading the post to be seen by 2400 people in total (Attachment 5). We have shared the finding aid and the website location with numerous local historical organizations and libraries to provide to their patrons and researchers. We have also contacted our local Ohio State Senator and Representative about the collection.

Within hours of posting the collection information online we started receiving research requests which we were then able to answer efficiently. We have also already received inquiries about how to donate collections to the Brownhelm Historical Association.

After consolidating the available collections and cataloguing what was pertinent, we found that the project took far less time than we first anticipated. However, we were able to achieve the objectives of our project and are extremely pleased with the result. We anticipate additional research requests and donations will continue to come and we intend to build upon this project by hosting lectures on genealogy research in the area and how to preserve family history items.

The Brownhelm Historical Association provided 57 volunteer hours for a total value of \$1,332.30 ($\23.07×57) as well as an additional \$37.19 in cash.
