Summary of Project Activities and Accomplishments

Lakeside Heritage Society (LHS) is a non-profit 501(c)(3) organization founded in 1968 for the purpose of preserving, promoting, and advancing the history of Lakeside, the Marblehead Peninsula and the Chautauqua Movement in America. Included in LHS's archival holdings are the Lakeside Annual Programs and Bulletins Collections which chronicle the events, programs and speakers of each summer season at Lakeside Chautauqua, dating from 1877 to present day. The nature and purpose of this project was to increase public access to the Lakeside Annual Programs and Bulletins Collections by continuing to build upon the digital content available in our online collections database.

Project funds were used towards completing the digitization of each collection by having annual programs from 1966 – 2023 and bulletins from 1966 - 1988 scanned for incorporation into our publicly accessible online database. Annual programs and bulletins were given to the Bowling Green State University's Center for Archival Collections Preservation Lab in May of 2023 for scanning, film transfer and OCR services. Approximately 1,409 images were created, accounting for \$493.15 of the \$520 budgeted for scanning services. The actual scanning cost came in under the original estimated amount due to format variations in a portion of the annual programs. The remaining \$26.85 was allocated towards the purchase of archival supplies to preserve the Lakeside annual programs that will continue to be produced each year by the Lakeside Association and added to the Lakeside Heritage Society collections.


An individual catalog record for each scanned program and bulletin was created within the PastPerfect collection management software and linked with their corresponding finding-aids for public view. As part of Lakeside Heritage Society's cash match, Archivist Kaysie Harrington spent approximately fifty hours at a rate of \$24/hour preparing and transferring documents for scanning, creating individual catalog records, and adding each PDF document to the public catalog. Volunteers spent approximately 15 hours assisting with catalog record creation at a rate of \$29.95/hour. A total of 170 individual catalog records were created and added to the publicly accessible portion of the PastPerfect catalog.



Narrative of self-assessment and evaluation

This project's goal to increase public access to the Lakeside Annual Programs and Lakeside Bulletins Collections was a success. Building from the momentum of a previous OHRAB digitization project, this project added 170 more documents to the LHS digital catalog for public research. Having this content available via the online catalog will allow LHS to connect its researchers and community members with its collections throughout the year, including during Lakeside Chautauqua's off-season. PDF/A copies of the programs and bulletins will also be stored in the LHS Google Drive, providing another level of preservation for these materials. This project was completed during Lakeside Chautauqua's sesquicentennial anniversary year, which has created greater community interest in local history. Having these materials available digitally will allow LHS to provide more resources for researchers and allow community members to connect with LHS collections remotely.

LHS will continue to build on this project by using the annual programs and bulletins collections as a model for future additions to the online digital catalog. Working on this project helped familiarize volunteers with PastPerfect and the cataloging process.
