#### Lakeside Heritage Society

Project: Lakeside Chautauqua National Historic Housing Stock Records Conversion for Public Access

#### September 16, 2024

#### Summary of the project:

The nature and purpose of the project is to convert architectural and remodeling records related to 990 Lakeside cottages, all in the Lakeside Historic District, to a publicly accessible PastPerfect database. While the data conversion is part of the matching funds, the \$4,800 requested grant funds will be used to fund a qualified contract employee who will review, evaluate, and update all 990 records to a consistent format in PastPerfect that can be made publicly available through the LHS website.

#### Summary of expenses:

\$8,000 in matching funds was paid on September 5, 2024 to the database software company PastPerfect for the conversion of the 990 cottage records.

#### Staff and Volunteer Time:

LHS Archivist time on the project thus far is 40 hours on mapping the record transfer process for the data conversion.

LHS Database Administrator time so far has been 5 hours working with the converted records and reviewing the 6.5 hours of work provided by the person contracted to review, evaluate and update the records in PastPerfect.

#### **Project Timeline:**

The project is on track to be completed by December 31, 2024. The expected delivery of the data map from PastPerfect was supposed to occur at the end of May. For a variety of reasons, the mapping was not completed until July and LHS did not receive the instructions for the records review and evaluation until Mid-August. The contract employee has only just begun the records review process. We are confident that the review and evaluation of all records will be completed and public access to all records on the LHS website will be available by the end of December.

#### Publicity:

The receipt of the grant was publicized in the LHS electronic and print version of the newsletter in May and was discussed at the Society's Annual Meeting on August 18, 2024. The newsletter and a copy of the Annual Meeting slide are attached.

I am pleased to announce that LHS has received a \$4,800 grant from the Ohio History and Records Advisory Board (OHRAB) to support our work of entering data into our Past-Perfect database about Lakeside cottages. Lakesider Doug Huber will review the cottage data on architectural

styles collected by the Lakeside Association during a cottage survey conducted in 2021. This data will be combined with the information that Lakeside Property Owners Association Block Captains are collecting about cottages in their neighborhoods, along with the information from past owners and photos that LHS already has in our files. The goal is to have a more complete record on each cottage in the database that can be shared with cottage owners and the Historic Preservation Design and Review Board (HPSRB) when requested.

Through a generous donation from Lakesider Jo Hackett, a mural will be painted this summer on the Heritage Archives back wall which faces the Fountain Inn parking lot. By the end of May, the wall will be repaired and painted blue. Watch for the artist's design to become a reality in July.

The Board of Trustees is evaluating the LHS 2021-2024 Strategic Plan. This work is being done in preparation for the writing of a new plan and goals for 2024-2027. If you have suggestions on goals for the new plan or for the direction of our organization, please share them with me.

If you have not renewed your 2024 membership, please do so soon. I look forward to working with many of you at the Memorial Day Recycle Sale or talking with you as you shop!


