

## **Trumbull County Historical Society Interim Report**

Ohio Historical Records Advisory Board Grant Digitization of Old Mahoning Cemetery Records

### **Summary of Project**

The Trumbull County Historical Society (TCHS) received funding from the Ohio Historical Records Advisory Board to digitize survey records from Old Mahoning Cemetery in Warren, Ohio. Through this grant of \$4570.00, TCHS has hired an intern to assist with the project to catalog digitize cemetery's records, including and the approximately 800 records, 600 photos, and 200 negatives. The goals for the project are to digitize all documents, photos & negatives and upload them to TCHS's online collections database; create a dedicated page on TCHS's website for the cemetery; and integrate the cemetery records & photos into Find A Grave.



## **Level of Completion**

Since the grant period began in May 2024, TCHS has hired an intern, India Gatts, for an allotted 200 hours of work. Gatts has almost completed the project's inventory of all the records, photos, and negatives. She has completed 50+ hours of research into the individuals buried in Old Mahoning Cemetery. The project is around 40% complete at this point.



#### Staff & Volunteer Time



Our intern has dedicated 100 hours to this project, reaching the midpoint of her 200-hour internship. During this time, she successfully labeled and inventoried approximately 730 of the 800 survey pages, along with their corresponding photos. She will soon begin digitizing these documents and photos into our digital database, CatalogIt.



#### **New Walking Tour Pamphlet**

A volunteer has spent roughly 25 hours working on a new selfguided walking tour pamphlet for the Old Mahoning Cemetery. Using the grant funds, purchased a new brochure holder for the cemetery to replace the weathered wooden box previously used to house an old walking tour guide. The new walking tour pamphlets will be freely available to those who visit the cemetery any time of year.

A new walking tour pamphlet for Old Mahoning Cemetery provides visitors with structured, а informative guide to the site's significant landmarks and stories. By highlighting the lives and contributions of those buried there, the pamphlet helps foster a deeper connection the community's heritage, encourages exploration, and ensures that these individuals' legacies remembered and celebrated by both locals and visitors.



## **Project Publicity**

Along with the OHRAB grant-funded project to digitize the cemetery records, we are also working on cleaning up the cemetery and conducting a ground penetrating radar (GPR) scan to search for unmarked graves. Dr. Matt O'Mansky from Youngstown State University volunteered his time and equipment to conduct the GPR scan. TCHS began clean-up days at Pioneer hosting Cemetery starting in May. Since then, we have removed over 100 bags of leaves from the cemetery, which has allowed us to uncover hidden headstones that haven't been seen in years.

WARREN, OH—The Trumbull County Historical Society is excited to announce a groundbreaking project at the Old Mahoning (Pioneer) Cemetery in Warren. Dr. Matt O'Mansky, a professor of Anthropology at Youngstown State University, is leading an innovative effort to map and uncover hidden headstones using ground-penetrating radar (GPR).

Pioneer Cemetery, a historical gem in Warren, holds the final resting places of many of the area's early settlers. The first burial there is recorded in 1804. Over the years, some headstones have become weathered, shifted, or buried, obscuring the complete historical record of the cemetery. Dr. O'Mansky's efforts aim to address this by using state-of-the-art GPR technology to accurately locate all existing headstones, including those that are currently covered and unseen.

This project is not only significant for historical preservation but also for enhancing the educational and cultural understanding of Warren's heritage. By mapping out the headstones, the Trumbull County Historical Society aims to create more detailed records and potentially discover new historical information about the early residents of the area.
